

Dayton O. Dec 11th 1826.

Dear Sir

Enclosed I send you a copy of a voucher signed by your brother, acting as your agent for one quarter salary.

Among the suspended accounts transmitted to the Indian department at Washington City, from this office - is the voucher, of which this is a copy. The remarks made in that office upon it - is as follows

"Abstract" "A"

"Vouch & Nathan Olney - salary \$375 -
The authority by which Cyrus Olney receipts for Nathan Olney must be shown"

"Suspended"

You will see by this that a power of attorney, to authorize your brother Cyrus to sign the voucher, is required, to be forwarded before the account can be paid. My impression is that such power was conferred by letter on in some way now forgotten. But no paper answering that description can be found in the office. Will you have the goodness to supply the defect - and transmit to the commissioners or to me at this place - and if to the former please

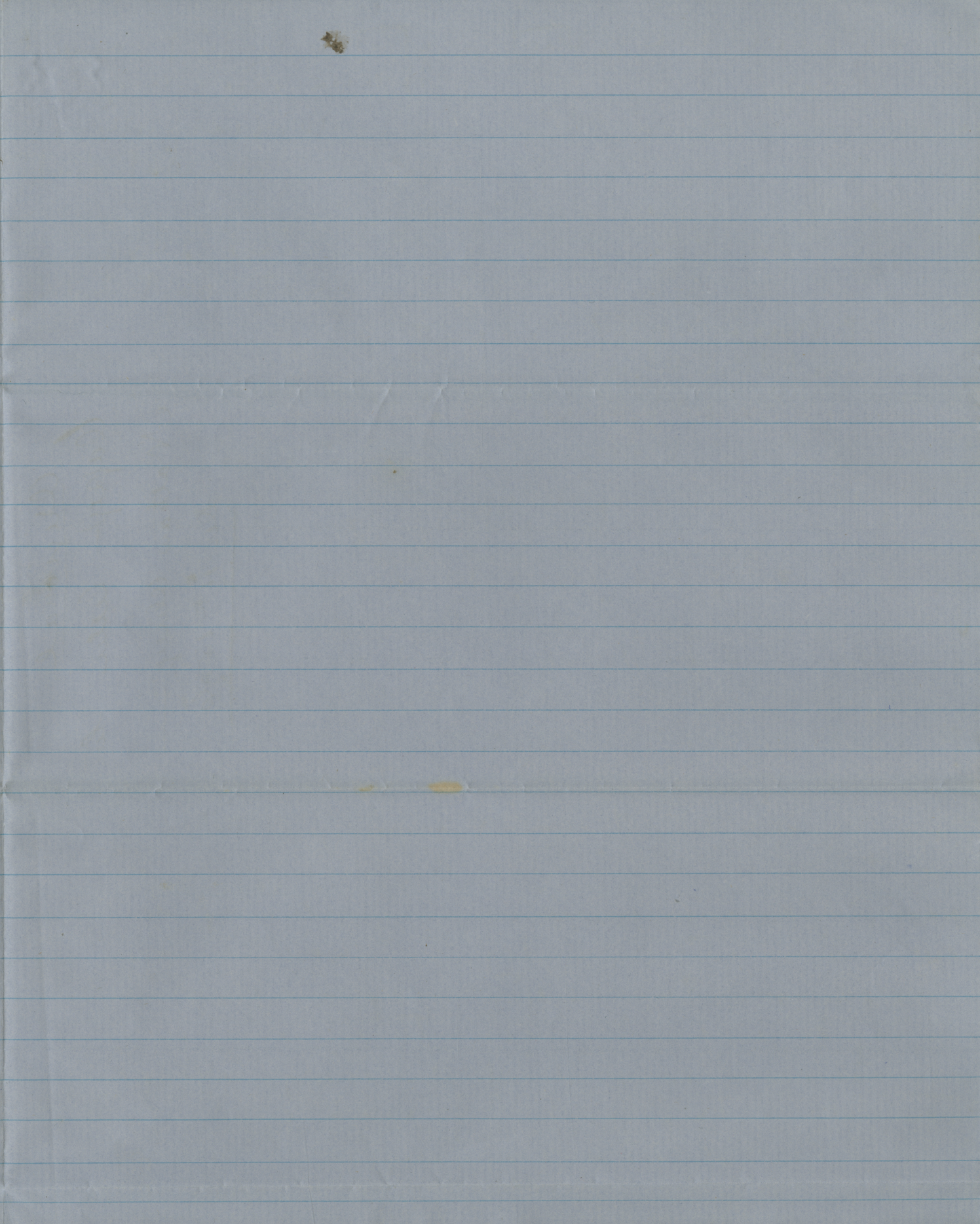
