Sinc my report of the upon the suspended account of
Samuel D. Culver Esq., ^{late} India Agent - for the trials in Oregon Territory,
there has been evidence adduced going to show that during
the period for which he stood suspended from the functions of
agent by my direction, and for which period his account was
disallowed by me, he was actually engaged in the service
and that, ^{said} for ~~that~~ period of service and the necessary expeditors
connected therewith as charged in his account, - ^{are} a legitimate
and proper charge against the government - and ought to
be paid - I am also satisfied, from information subsequently
obtained, that the charge for services and expenditures as shown
in his account, which were disallowed upon the ground
that he was out of his district, more services and expenditures
necessarily pertaining to the closing up his account and
as such ought to be allowed; so also, with the bill of
sums subsequently submitted to the department, as expenditures
necessarily made, in the performance of his duties, after
