Dear Sir

The department at Washington City appear to  
struggle a great deal over your accounts. additional  
applications are demanded. <sup>copies of</sup> The memorandums  
made in the commissary office upon your account  
are herewith enclosed. It appears the articles  
furnished by yourself is not receipted  
and to supply this defect 2 have filled up  
additional duplicate vouchers for you  
to sign. put your name to the receipt,  
and then to the certificate officially

a certificate is appended to the vouchers  
for your signature explaining the reason  
of the difference in time of horse hire. This  
has been examined from my own recollection  
of the business, that recollection may  
however be incorrect and if so you  
will draw up and sign a certificate  
impeaching the facts. The amt

stated as one charge on account of delay  
you will of course refund to me, and  
should these applications prove insufficient  
in amount then in paying the accounts  
I shall expect you to refund me that  
amount also as the settlement of my accounts  
is suspended in consequence thereof. and the

next moon will be a disallowance -

It is expected each agent will perfect his own accounts - and the defunct holds him and his securities responsible until that is done - I hope however that the fellows up this signy this March and the certificate when sent forward will prove satisfactory -
