My dear General,

9 P.M.

The following is a copy of a letter of the 7 inst from Mr. Frank Cooper of Salem to Gov. Gibbs.

"Things have transpired in the last few days that make it my duty to write you. I am no alarmist, but I know of my own knowledge that there are (4,644) four thousand six hundred and forty four men <a href="sworn">sworn</a> to make civil war, against men? the loyal interacts of this state, within (10) ten days from this date, if they can find excuse;— if not they are going to effect oppose the Draft. The mail is just closed and I must close."

I send you this as you should be apprised of what is said. The threats may be vaporing. But it is well to be on our guard. I don't know Mr. Cooper. Gov. Gibbs says that "so far as he knows he is a reliable man."

The threat to rise in case of reelection of Lincoln has been made in various quarters. I want the aid and advice of cool heads. I don't want to do anything unadvisedly. I shall if there is any commotion aim to welcome the assistance of all the loyal (the truly loyal) of all parties of all devoted to the preservation of peace.

Please write me when you know anything which might interest. Ought this letter to be published? It would help the Recruiting.
