

John W. Pintard's Letter

New York. 5th Oct. 1790

Joseph Beaulieu Esq

Dear Sir

I have your favor of

20th Ult. I shall take care to mention what you write respecting the Columbia in case any report reaches this of ^{her being} the leaky. I hope she will prove a tight ship & more fortunate in her present expedition than what the last is likely to be. Mr Livingston is out of town at present, from what he said to me I concluded he w^d. have written to you I shall call on him again when he returns - I do not presume that you can consider me any way interested in the concern as from what I all along wrote was to the contrary - I am too much disappointed in the Jay to venture so far from shore in a hurry again - The want of cash is a complaint this way as well as yours - I am sorry for the debt for £100 say. which has not yet appeared but shall be paid at maturity, as I am considered

Oby in advance I have not yet sold any fees in
hopes of their sale - Boston is current at 2/10 Curr.
They ask 2/10 for what has arrived from Boston.
I hope you will push Vance for payment as it will
not do to defer this matter any longer - If he
refuse you will commence an action agt him
immediately, as it is a shame to be kept out of
that bill so long.
