

Dayton O. G. Nov 25th 1857.

Sir

I have the honor to enclose three
certified duplicate vouchers on account
against the Indian Department, &lets Agency
in favor of J D E Palmer - as follows
one for Plowing & breaking rails amounting
to one thousand dollars
one for Farming implements, tools &c amounting
to eight hundred eighty and 30/100 dollars
One for provisions amounting to one
hundred fifteen and 90/100 dollars
In the aggregate (\$1996 $\frac{20}{100}$) Nineteen hundred
ninety six and 20/100 dollars.

Our object in forwarding to your
office is, that the account may be placed
in a position to be liquidated at the earliest
possible moment.

As will be observed, this account
has already been due eight months, and
if we are compelled to await its transmission
to, and return from Washington city
it must work greatly to our disadvantage
but as you deemed this, ^{at our last interview} the only means to
insure its payment, you will concur a few
days forwarding at the earliest moment
over

It appears to me that the certificate of
the agent, ought to be evidence sufficient
to warrant its payment - but it may
require your recommendation and if
they (the accounting offices) have scruples
as to the necessity for these expenditures, they
may require testimony in reference thereto;
but that fact would imply a want of
confidence in the integrity of the acting
agent who certifies, that the account is
correct and just, and that the amount
is due us. If it was necessary
to collect the funds upon a reservation
it is equally necessary to take the ~~next~~^{proper}
steps to insure ^{means of} subsistence for the party
a crop involved the expense of plowing, sowing
and tools the month with - and for the
latter the agent acknowledges himself responsible
to the Treasury of the United States - and
as he is under bond ^{with option} security
for all that comes into his hands
It seems to me unnecessary to adduce
additional testimony
