Northwest of California in Latitude 38 is the Harbour of St. Francis Drake where he remained five weeks from the 17th of June 1573 and with remarkable Formid Ceremony on a Free Surrender of the Nation took possession of the Country for Queen Elizabeth sailing to New Albion.

The Province of East Florida  
Is bounded to the Westward by the Gulf of Mexico & the Apalachicola River to the Northward by a Line drawn from that part of the said River where the Catahouche & Flint Rivers meet to the Source of the Marys River, and by the Course of the said River to the Atlantic Ocean and the Gulf of Florida including all Islands within six Leagues of the Sea Coast.

The Province of West Florida  
Is bounded to the Southward by the Gulf of Mexico including all Islands within six Leagues of the Coast from the River Apalachicola to Lake Pontchartrain to the Westward by the said Lake the Lake Maniapas and the River Mississippi to the Northward by a Line drawn due East from that part of the River Mississippi which lies on 31 Degree North Latitude to the River Apalachicola to the Catahouchee and to the Eastward by the said River.

The Province of Quebec.  
Is bounded on the Labrador Coast by the River St. Lawrence from the Mouth of the said River to the Bay of Fundy through the Lake St. John to the End of the Lake St. Pierre from whence the said Lake overflows the River St. Lawrence to the Lake Champlain on 45 Degree North Latitude which along the high Land which divides the Rivers that empty themselves into the said River of St. Lawrence, from thence which falls into the Gulf of the North Cape of the Bay the Indians make the Great Gulf of St. Lawrence to Cape Rosier from thence over the Mouth of the River St. Lawrence by the West End of the Island of Anticosti to the adjacent River of St. John.

The Government of Grenada.  
Comprehends the Island of that name together with the Grenadines and the Islands of Dominica St. Vincent and Tobago.

The Sacramento Colony opposite to Buenos Ayres granted to the Spaniards by a Treaty with the Portuguese, 1730.

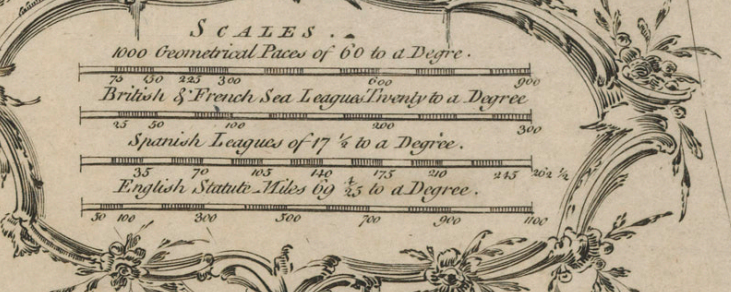
In 1748 the Governor of Buenos Ayres by Order of the King of Spain caused the supposed Communication of Julian Bay with Campana River into the South Sea to be examined, which it thereupon was declared to be imaginary.

York Isle or Islands inhabited Latitude 58 37 about 30 Leagues from the Coast, first found by Capt. B. Harris in Oct. 1685; the People being all there ashore.

Malouin Isles.  
This Land was first discovered by St. Roch's Harboure 1559 which he named Malineland in Honour of the Queen. The name of Falkland was given afterwards to some new part thereof by Capt. Strong.

The Isthmus of Panama which joins the two Continents of America divides the whole into NORTH & SOUTH AMERICA.
