of the Tillamook, Siuslaw, Lower Umpqua
Cove Bay, Coquill, To-So-ta-ney,
and Chitwas and having executed
and filed with me a bond in the penal
sum of five thousand dollars with Aaron
E. Mail & Son E. Ainsworth as sureties, condition-
al as required by Law for the faithful
observance of all the laws and regulations
provided for the Government of Trade
and Intercourse with the Indian Tribes,
and reposing special ~~confidence~~ trust
and confidence in the Probity,
Honesty and earnest business habits of
the said applicant, and being satisfied
that he is a citizen of the United States
as required by Law - He is hereby
authorized
