Oregon Wild Life Pictures Popular Throughout East

A new series of Oregon wild life motion picture films produced by William L. Finley, Oregon naturalist, and now being shown by him in the east, are meeting with an enthusiastic response, Mr. Finley reports in a letter received yesterday by a friend in Portland.

A particularly effective presentation, Mr. Finley reported, has been a pictorial comparison of the present arid condition of certain southern Oregon sections with pictures of the same region made 20 years ago, showing the lakes full of water.

The new Finley pictures also feature the Columbia river and point out the need of adequate fishways to conserve the salmon run,

Beaver, according to an opinion expressed by Mr. Finley, are Oregon's most valuable wild animal because their dams prevent soil erosion, conserve water and create trout streams,

"A beaver hide," Mr. Finley wrote, "is worth \$10 to \$15, whereas a live beaver is worth \$300 to the state."

William Finley to Give Nature Lecture Feb. 28

Under the combined auspices of the Evanston Bird club and the Woman's Club of Evanston, William Lovell Finley, nationally known naturalist, will give a lecture with motion pictures on "Where Rolls the Oregon," to which the public is invited, at 8 p.m. Thursday, Feb. 28, at the Woman's club.

Mrs. Frederick H. Pattee, 2516 Lincoln street, president of the Bird club, and Mrs. Guy M. Pelton, third vice-president and program chairman of the Woman's club, will make arrangements for the lecture.

Mr. Finley is on the editorial staff of Nature Magazine, director of wild life conservation of the American Nature association, national director of the Izaak Walton League of America and a member of the editorial board of Outdoor America.

The pictures Mr. Finley will show were taken in Oregon, where he has served as state game warden, a member of the game reserve, and honorary president of the Oregon Audubon society. As a member of the advisory board of the United States Department of Agriculture he had a part in drawing up the migratory bird treaty act.

Mr. Finley appeared in Evanston under the auspices of the Bird club in 1923, 1926 and 1928. The reels he will show are all new to Evanston audiences and will emphasize the lecturer's belief in the need for conservation of wild life.
