The Oregon State Planning Board received, Cotober 1, 1935, a request from the Oregon State Council of the Izaak Walton League of America that the Board urge acquisition of Wapato Lake in the Willamesto Valley in Oregon as a permanent wild fowl preserve. A copy of the resolution of the State Council of the Izaak Walton League to the State Planning Board on this subject is emclosed.

At meeting October 18, 1958, the State Planning Board referred this resolution to its Advisory Committee on Wild Life for consideration and report thereon to the Board.

On October 25 Mr. W. L. Finley, Chairman of the Board's Advisory Committee on Wild Life, reporting to the Beard on this resolution, recommended that the Beard request the United States Biological Survey to purchase Wapato Lake from money collected on the Duck Stemp Tax and that this area be established as a wild life preserve and duck refuge. A copy of Mr. Finley's letter of October 25 transmitting this recommendation to the Board is enclosed.

The State Planning Board at meeting November 15 considered the resolution from the Oregon State Council of the Isaak Walton League and Mr. Finley's recommendations thereon. The Board concurred on Mr. Finley's recommendations and adopted the motion urging the United States Biological Survey to acquire Wapato Lake in accordance with these recommendations. Mr. Finley states that he would also write to you direct on this matter.

Will you please let me know how the Biological Survey feels about this matter and of any action it may take toward acquiring Wapato Lake and establishing a wild fowl and duck preserve in that area.
