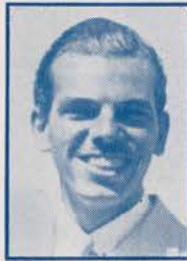
Sunday "Caravan Trails in Arabia" **3:30**

3:30 "An Hour with Tony Sarg" (Especially for Children). First comes a humorous introduction in the inimitable Tony Sarg manner. Then a series of marionette appearances—Professor Bumps at the Piano, The Royal Juggler, Tippy-Toes the Dancer, the Fighting Marionettes in Armor, Greedy George (his table manners are terrible!), Jack Tarr, Dancing Sailor, the Singing and Dancing General, Punch and Judy, Charlie. Next, Tony Sarg takes the stage for some lightning sketches. Then the funny finale—The Bumble Bee and the Cough Medicine.

8:30 "Tony Sarg Entertains" (Especially for Adults). Tony Sarg opens with a brief, funny account of the trials and tribulations of an artist. Next he offers a swift series of short marionette skits and playlets, presenting every kind of marionette. You see marionette ballet dancers, the only eating and drinking marionette, a marionette magician, a marionette ventriloquist. Then comes Tony Sarg's famous demonstration of lightning sketches, with members of the audience as models.

Captain Smith, soldier-orator, leads us to enchanted lands. We see the sunlit isle of Bali, famed for the beauty of its women. We cross to Asia by way of Singapore.
